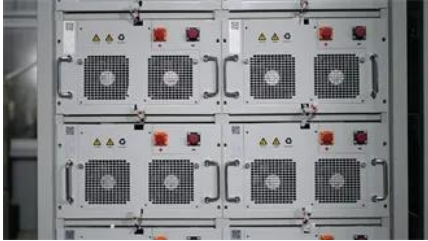
## Overview
